

- With Council over the "Deferred Lands" planning proposal
- With NPWS requesting better enforcement of regulations affecting the use of the National Park e.g. litter, graffiti and dogs.
- Submission to CCC regarding draft Central Coast Thematic History.
- Submission to Council questioning some development approvals and proposals that do not seem to be in accordance with the Local E3nvironment Plan and/or the Local Development Control Plan.
- Discussions with Council over conserving dune vegetation and the ecology of the Pearl Beach lagoons and creeks.

We are keen to hear ideas about environmentally themed talks and films you might want to have in the Hall.

We are also looking for volunteers to put together a useful Environment themed website for Pearl Beach (or perhaps for the whole Peninsula?).

Carol Serventy



Carol Serventy, patron of the Crommelin Native Arboretum passed away on 12 December 2023 at age 93. She had been patron from 2007 and before that jointly with her husband Vincent Serventy. Carol worked with us in the Arboretum for many, many years. While she moved to live with her family in Lismore several years ago, she had been in our thoughts since moving.

Carol was a well-respected wildlife conservation expert coauthoring multiple books and other publications on Australian Wildlife and made significant contributions to Australian Conservation efforts often in collaboration with her husband Vincent. The Serventys' were forerunners to the Leyland Brothers and as a family with three small children (Natasha. Cathy and Matthew) travelled extensively in a caravan throughout Australia, filming for television and often having close friends with them such as John Olsen.

In 1980 she was awarded an Officer of the Order of Australia (OAM) for her services to conservation.

She had a long association with The Australian Museum. Carol was chairman of the Interim Steering Committee that established The Australian Museum Society (1972-1973). She was also a member of the Australian Museum Council (1976 - 1986), and the National Photographic Index of Australian Wildlife Council.

In addition to her Australian roles Carol served on multiple international museum councils and organisations including as President of Honour of the World Federation of Friends of Museums (2000 - 2003).

She also had a long association with board of The Women's Club, Sydney from 2001 where she served as Treasurer and then President. These were roles she enjoyed immensely and excelled at, improving the investment portfolio and overseeing renovations to the Club. She sourced many guest speakers but also stepped in and made presentations when needed herself. Her early years as an actor may have helped. Carol had a lot of close friends in TWC and all are sad at her passing

As well as her public passions and works, Carol loved reading and her garden, spending many years in Pearl Beach. Although living half her life in NSW, her heart remained in many ways in WA where she was born and where she and her family travelled extensively.
