For the second year the Pearl Beach Environment Group (PBEG)- in association with the Pearl Beach Arboretum – have held a community competition for the annual National Tree Day. A joint Tree Day event was also held at the Arboretum.

The Pearl Beach community greatly values its mature trees and its bushland setting. An objective of the Pearl Beach Progress Association is "to protect and enhance the environment and encourage nature conservation within the village of Pearl Beach". Bushfire outlook

The National Fire Safety Council AFAC has released its Spring fire outlook, showing increased fire risk for much of Eastern Australia including Pearl Beach.

After 3 wet years we have increased fuel loads, which are now drying out as drier El Nino weather returns. It's not 2019 conditions yet, but the outlook is for increased risk.

It's time to prepare your property and update your plan. RFS Get Ready day is Saturday 16 September and information on how to prepare is at: www.rfs.nsw.gov.au



Bushfire Alerts

The availability of the official RFS alert app Hazards Near Me (formerly Fires Near Me) has largely superseded the Neighbour Alert SMS warning system at Pearl Beach.

To avoid confusion and overlap, PBPA and SAG have decided to discontinue the Neighbour Alert system, and it will no longer be used to send alerts to residents. The network of Street Contacts previously used to update contact lists for Neighbour Alert will also be disbanded.

If you haven't already, you should install Hazards Near Me right now, and set a Watch Zone around Pearl Beach* to automatically receive the latest alerts, and enable notifications from the app. This app contains essential Fire Emergency Info.

(* a watch zone of 6km around Patonga Drive will catch any fire within Brisbane Water National Park likely to threaten Pearl Beach.)

Everyone should also have a radio that can operate on batteries to get the latest information from ABC 94.5FM if power and internet are cut.

Understanding bushfire risks

Pearl Beach is surrounded by thick bush in Brisbane Water National Park with a dangerous fire possible at any time. The worst bushfire weather – hot Westerly or Northerly winds will quickly push a bushfire into and through Pearl Beach, with thick smoke and embers making the beach an uncomfortable and a dangerous place to shelter.

A fire can quickly cut the only road access, along with power, mobile phones and NBN internet which all rely on the same powerline following the road, trapping residents with very limited support.

Your options are STAY AND DEFEND your property or GO somewhere safe. If residents do not have a PLAN and choose a safe option while you can, the alternative is TRAPPED and in danger.

Only STAY if you and your property are well prepared. If you can't safely defend your property with greatly reduced water pressure and power cut, your only safe option is to GO. Early. No home is defensable in CATASTROPHIC fire weather.

There are 100x more properties under threat than fire trucks – don't rely on emergency services being able to rescue you in an emergency – they probably won't.

If you are trapped in Pearl Beach go to a Neighbourhood Safer Place before the fire arrives:

- Community Hall, 9 Diamond Road – with fire protection sprinklers and backup power.
- Beach by the Amenities Block.

Community Support Centre Project – Hall "Neighbourhood Safer Place"

The Neighbour Safer Place (NSP) is operational with sprinklers and backup power systems installed, operating procedures, PPE (personal protection equipment) and First Aid equipment ready to go.

After a long wait for a spearpoint licence, we recently received approval from WaterNSW and the water capacity will soon be expanded with the installation of our spearpoint pump. This will allow us to operate the sprinklers for up to 24hrs and supply additional water to RFS trucks.

Bushfire Season starts in October, we will hold NSP familiarisation sessions at the Hall Wed 11th and Sat 14th October at 3:30pm. Anyone that might need to shelter there (ie everyone in Pearl Beach) are strongly encouraged to attend one of these 30-minute sessions as it's important residents have knowledge of the NSP. Register

Beach safety

Surf Lifesaving NSW have installed an Emergency Beacon (telephone) on the beach at the Agate Ave (central) entrance to the beach.

Pearl Beach is UNPATROLLED, the drop-off is steep, and waves and rips are strong - particularly at the Northern end of our beach. Be aware of the danger, and especially careful with children and weaker swimmers. The Southern end of the beach and ocean pool are safer.

Emergency equipment at the beach includes Yellow Rescue Tubes near the Amenities block and Northern end of the beach, and a Red Life Preserver Ring at the ocean rock pool.

Public access Defibrillators (AEDs) are kept at the beach (Amethyst Ave amenities block), Community Hall and Tennis Courts. The nearest ambulance station is 15 mins away – AEDs greatly improve survival from cardiac arrest if used in the first 10 mins.

SAG has been in liaison with the Council regarding:

- Rock pool next clean by Council is being scheduled, tides permitting, prior to school holodays.
- Clearer signage on use of the Emergency Response Beacon (ERB).
- Plan is to install two new cabinets to house Yellow Rescue Tubes - one at the Nth Coral beach entrance, another at the laneway entry off Coral and move Agate to next to the ERB.
- Additional signage a sign at the Amenities block Defibrillator with directions to the emergency beacon 300m north, and one at the ERB saying there's a AED at the amenities block. PEARL BEACH SAFETY EQUIPMENT LOCATIONS

Mobile Phone Reception

Poor mobile phone reception issues are familiar to many residents particularly in the fringe areas of the village where the line-of-sight from the mobile tower is affected by hills, trees and buildings. The Progress Association has made representations to Communications Alliance (company representing the major telcos) in January detailing poor mobile reception, seeking their assistance engaging the mobile networks to improve the local mobile tower.

This led to a chain of communications between the Communications Alliance, Telstra and PBPA where Telstra claim their signal is satisfactory and meets their coverage standards. Likewise, Optus and TPG both claim there are no operational issues with their signal.

Both the Department of Communications and Telstra suggest additional technologies to assist improved connectivity, such as an external antenna, authorised repeaters and WiFi calling options. These are expensive but offer a solution for homes that require a reliable signal.

At the invitation of the Minister for Infrastructure. Transport. Regional Development & the Arts (includes Communications) Michelle Rowlands MP. we made a submission to the public consultation on the Peri-Urban Mobile Program (PUMP) for Commonwealth grants to improve mobile reception in areas like Pearl Beach. We are hopeful but not terribly optimistic the PUMP Guidelines will change to improve the chances of Pearl Beach receiving funding.

We also requested from Minister Rowlands a mobile phone reception monitoring device to enable us to document the poor signals around Pearl Beach. This was declined, but as we are effectively in a Catch-22 situation with our phone reception, we have sought the Minister's reconsideration.

Are we confident of achieving a positive outcome? Not at this stage, but still pushing and trying.

Seeking Volunteers for the RFS Community Fire Unit

Community Fire Unit (CFU) is operated by a team of local resident volunteers support the RFS/Pearl Beach Brigade to enhance safety and resilience to bushfires.

The CFU operates from a trailer rather than a firetruck, and require less training than other RFS volunteers. CFU activities include:

- Extinguishing spot fires and managing ember attacks within Pearl Beach until the RFS arrives.
- Extinguishing fires following the passing of a bushfire front.
- Flood mitigation such as pumping water away from trouble spots

Pearl Beach – Speed limit and shared use zone

Council advised in August that Transport NSW issued their new policy on speed limits which they are currently evaluating. Any decision will be subject to budget limitations – we have suggested Council move forward as quickly as possible by installing a 40KM speed limit as a first step.

Ocean Beach Surf Life Saving Club has won an award for their engagement with the Pearl Beach community and visitors to deliver water safety and drowning prevention education. Their program 'Taking it to the Beach' received the Surf Life Saving NSW's Awards of Excellence for Innovation.

The club's education team, Peter and Louise Lambeth, along with several of the club's youth have delivered 9 water safety education sessions over an 18-month period. The main aim of Surf Life Saving is to prevent drownings. This is the 'why' a program like this is so important.

The team have loved being at Pearl Beach, meeting the residents, chatting to visitors, and enjoying the stunning view. They will be back at Pearl Beach in the upcoming school holidays.
