
### ACTION UNDERWAY

## **External Liaison - Purpose**

- 1. To manage ongoing relationships with members of state and federal government and other community groups
- 2. To be the prime contact and to manage ongoing relationships with Central Coast Council (CCC), State and Federal Government with particular reference to:
  - i. Maintenance and improvement of our roads, verges, roadside drainage and other infrastructure assets.
  - ii. Matters relating to safety, environmental, heritage and public health matters
- 3. To coordinate with and assist other PBPA groups with regard to relationships with the above parties







### **External Liaison - Progress to date**

- Contact made with CCC Director of Infrastructure Services, Boris Bolgoff and others
- Recommended use of CCC Customer Service Centre for reporting issues relating to potholes, general roads maintenance, footpaths and others
- Coordinated approach with members to raise road and other defects and to monitor progress of rectification
- Agreed to check in with the Director within a month to discuss progress
- Met with Leisl Tesch to discuss support on a number of local and state government ongoing matters





### **External Liaison – Next Steps**

- Determine further scoping for the 'EL' group from a member's survey
- To meet and discuss progress on road defects with the CCC Director of Infrastructure
- To carry out a mini survey of our roads to identify issues relating to potholes, edge breaks, cracking, pumping, drainage issues etc
- To meet with CCC to discuss preventative maintenance strategy with respect to the above and support their application for grants
- Contact with TfNSW










## Central Coast Council Capital Works Program 22/23. Actual dates tbc and reported back to PBPA

### **Purpose - Grants**

- To build on the successful grant applications that have already been achieved in Pearl Beach
- To create an evolving list of projects that may be applicable for federal, state and community grants. Initial candidate projects include the Community Hall upgrades
- Most likely funding source being the Community Development Grant Program. \$400k/yr across region, typical \$20k projects. Open Jun 23
- To coordinate and assist other groups in grant applications, reporting and supervision


