SAG roles & responsibilities have over time included:-

- Beach Safety (rescue tubes, emergency beacon, pool cleaning)
- · First Aid kits and Hall Safety Review
- Neighbour Alert System / Street Contacts ceased in 2022 due to the Hazards Near Me app being the most relevant and reliable emergency communication source
- Establish Community Support Centre / Neighbourhood Safer Place with grant of \$96k
- Establish CFU (Community Fire Unit) in close relationship with RFS. CFU future bleak due to lack of volunteers
- Mobile Phone connectivity issues Despite much lobbying Fed Govt members, Ministers, Telcos no resolution in sight
- Fund raising \$35k Sept 2020-Jan 2021

Outstanding Community Support Centre tasks to be completed by Paul Toohey & Ben Kearney

- Complete Spearpoint installation (funds available \$8,315 + \$2,615)
- Complete end of project reports to Fed & NSW Governments by 31st March 2024
- Complete training of community on use of Centre

Roles and responsibilities of SAG are to be absorbed into the Progress Association Executive until such time as new roles/responsibilities are agreed and volunteers found to establish a new sub committee.



"to protect and enhance the environment and encourage nature conservation within the village of Pearl Beach".

The definition of 'environment' is used in its broadest sense, which includes both the 'built' and the 'natural' environment, and the 'environmental setting' of Pearl Beach.

Objectives for 2024

- 1. Continuing to develop a more effective working relationship with Central Coast Council.
- 2. Comment on relevant council & state government environmental policies and strategic issues in a timely manner.
- 3. Comment on relevant development and planning proposals in a timely manner.
- 4. Educating the local community about relevant environmental issues including:
 - low impact and sustainable design for new housing in bushland suburbs
 - landscape design for conservation of native flora and fauna.

Recent Activities

- 1. Submission to CCC regarding the Deferred Lands proposal.
- 2. Submission to NPWS requesting better enforcement of regulations affecting the use of National Parks eg no access to dogs.
- 3. Request for 'no access for dogs' note for sensitive areas on the proposed Pearl Beach area map on the amenities block.
- 4. Submission to CCC regarding draft Central Coast Thematic History.
- 5. Submission to CCC regarding unauthorised building works and tree removal at a property in Cornelian Road.
- 6. Multiple submissions to CCC regarding unauthorised removal of vegetation on beach foreshore dune area in Tourmaline Avenue.
- 7. Submission to CCC regarding opening up of southern lagoon and Green Point Creek.

Formosa Lily Ilium formosanum

This plant is rapidly becoming a naturalised weed in many states of Australia infesting roadsides, disturbed areas, wastelands and even bushland.

Habit: Deciduous perennial herb with annual flowering stalks 1-2m long.

Flowers: Large trumpet shaped highly fragrant flowers, pure white on the inside, pink or purple/brown stripes on the outside bearing prominent yellow anthers. Summer.

Dispersal: Seeds, bulbs and bulb scales spread by water, wind, humans, contaminated soil (earthmoving equipment, car tyres etc) and garden refuse dumping.

Control: Difficult. Hand dig, ensuring all scales are removed. Best done before flowering. Extensive follow-up required. Remove and bag seed heads (capsules). Foliar sprays ineffective.

Not to be confused with the native Swamp Lily Crinum pedunculatum


