## **Scope of Sub Committee:**

#### MAINTENANCE

- Monday 20<sup>TH</sup> February: WORKING BEE: contact Paul Barclaire cleaning of external building. Some minor painting, Reviewing storage, Relocating paint and gas bottles.
- Fire compliance pursuing confirmation of required works to ensure compliance.
- Kitchen new signs in place for operation of stove and dishwasher. Planned stocktake and purchase of items if needed.
- Minor maintenance quotes requested clearing of roof, keeping bamboo clear of passageway, mowing grass outside war memorial blowing leaves into a pile and placing in green bin (or perhaps a volunteer for these last two jobs).
- Plus a couple of one off jobs clearing of leaves in skylights over deck, high cleaning inside hall
- Quote requested to eradicate leak around skylight

#### HALL UPGRADE

- Quotes received for floor oil treatment is about \$10,000

- Proposed higher fence by neighbour 7 Diamond Rd. Karina met with him and looked at more detailed proposals. Will ask for samples of materials to be used. He will pay the full cost.

## **PBSAG – February Update**

## **Community Support Centre (CSC)**

- Lean-to shed: Just requires painting
- Successful launch / Opening on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> Dec Media Release
- Spearpoint Water Access License Matter to be resolved within the next few weeks (Minister Andersons & Premier's Office)
- NSP (Neighbourhood Safer place) Operations manual being written. Volunteers required – see Paul. Presentation material is on back deck
- Current \$9k shortfall to be covered by special Premier's grant + Bunnings sausage sizzle fund raiser on 5<sup>th</sup> Feb



- Street Contacts contacted their neighbouring residents in Dec/Jan to update records. Slow responses received due to holiday period – expect to finalise in February .
- Provided Neighbour Alert information and Fridge Magnets with Neighbour Alert Bulletin to Pearl Beach Real Estate (ACCOM) and Coast Reality. Also, provided them with a supply of our Red Bag Welcome packs for new owners.

#### **Mobile Phone Reception Issues**

- Letters received 14 Dec 2022 from Dr Gordon Reid MP and Fed Minister for Communications Michelle Rowlands – confirmed PB eligible for grant under Peri-Urban Mobile Program (PUMP) – Govt provide grants to Telcos for upgrading tower coverage.
- Letter sent by PBPA to Communications Alliance group representing major Telcos, seeking their assistance in presenting the PB mobile phone issue to the Telcos......Telcos need to agree and fund 50% of upgrade costs.

- Rock Pool was cleaned 10<sup>th</sup> Dec
- CCC declined to provide Lifesaver for PB over Xmas/New Year & Jan holiday periods
- Council's Craig Healy and Ocean Beach Surf Life Saving Club's Louise Lambert ran a number of very successful beach safety events over holiday period

#### **Speed Limit and Shared Use Zone**

## a natural & cultural inheritance

Pearl Beach village has spectacular scenic qualities set in a small, friendly, caring community which enjoys living in the middle of a national park - Brisbane Water National Park.

Thanks to the stewardship and foresight of previous generations, a remarkable diversity of plants and animals still exists here.

For many thousands of years the traditional Aboriginal owners and custodians of the land - the Darkingjung people combined fishing and harvesting animals in the sheltered bay and fertile sandplain.

In March 1788 when the first Europeans

at the southern end of the beach, the Aborigines helped to pull up their boats

For the next 130 years, because of its isolation and difficult access, our sandplain escaped clearing and colonial settlement. Some trees were cut in the 1850s by Rock Davis (a ship builder and early landholder), and in the 1880s by timber-getters for the Sydney-Gosford glossy black cockatoos and rock warblers). Railway line, but the area remained uninhabited.

In 1921 the Rock Davis Estate was bought by real estate developer Charles Staples, who subdivided it into 570 blocks and cut a road (now a cliff path) below Mt Ettalong.

(Governor Phillip and crew) rowed ashore Still 'Pearly' remained largely undeveloped - in 1950 there were only 90 dwellings.

> Today the village has around 600 blocks, but as most streets and properties retain a natural tree cover, native animals have something in which to feed, shelter and breed. Thus, our wildlife includes an impressive array of rare and threatened species (eg koalas, quolls,

> Pearly's natural heritage has inspired many artists, musicians, poets and writers. Help ensure this rich heritage is passed on to future generations to enjoy - by sharing and protecting our unique plant and animal communities.

## an environmental gem to



The male satin bowerbird is a regular garden visitor, he collects blue trinkets and loves blueberry ash trees

In recognition of the significance of our village and its environmental and historic features, Pearl Beach is listed by the National Trust (NSW). Many well-known environmentalists have settled in Pearl Beach and contributed to its conservation, including Minard Crommelin, Lois Westlake and Vincent Serventy.

To ensure this proud conservation tradition continues in the community, our overview is presented as a reference for use by all residents and visitors.

We hope the guide helps everyone understand and appreciate the high environmental and aesthetic values of our village, its wildlife and setting surrounded by sea and national park.



- And a replacement for our collapsed boardwalk.


## Pearl Beach Plodders

Sadly we lost a good friend of Pearl Beach on Sunday 8<sup>th</sup> January, 2023

Tom migrated to Australia from London 1951with his parents, they started out from the migrant hostel in Dundas, his first job was with Australian Abrasives.

Then in 1953 he joined the the RAAF where he learnt to fly, a stint with Schweps , then into the Insurance industry,the highlights a posting with Skandia to Hong Kong later Papua New Guinea, Kaula Lumpa, Perth, and Gosford with Queensland Insurance .

He retired from the workforce at Pearl Beach in the early 90s . He was the treasurer for the PBPA for 18 years and most of those years delivered the Gem newsletter over the whole beach and knew where every box was hidden.

His health declining so he and Pim moved to Ettalong to a smaller villa and occupied himself with his racing friends his maths and computer. He loved a party a glass or two of wine and a good chat, He died with Pim in mid sentance at home, without pain or drama.
