

# Safety Advisory Group (PBSAG) Convenor: Paul Toohey



### **Community Support Centre Project**

- A safer location for residents and visitors during catastrophic events such as a bushfire or other emergencies.
- Black Summer Bushfire Recovery Grant \$91,680. Funds remaining \$9,265 versus estimation to completion budget \$11,595 deficit \$2,330. Reviewing material costs in an endeavour to reduce the call on PA Funds.
- Project Status Update
  - A. Solar backup power system \$45K

Installation and commissioning complete. Solar (7.4kW), batteries (24 kWh – 2.9kW load limit) and generator (10 kVA) operating as per design.

Automatic operation uses solar first, then batteries (down to 30%), then grid import (rare). Generator will automatically start on loss of grid (as required after solar + batteries). Uninterrupted supply to hall independent of grid for >48hrs.

**B. Bushfire sprinkler system** 

Installation 95% complete except for spearpoint. Testing and commissioning by Waterflow Plumbing. Initial testing shows system operating as expected.

Tanks 18,000 litres complete and commissioned.

Water NSW spearpoint licence remains an issue. Letters sent to Ministers – Lands & Water and Emergency Services.



### **Community Support Centre Project**

- Project Status Update (cont.)
  - C. Yet to Do
  - Lean-to shed over generator and pumps. Weatherboard subject to pricing or if too expensive Colarbond.
  - Paint plantroom doors
  - PPE equipment including radios & CFU radios.
  - Plumber to finish minor work, training and commissioning.
  - Operating procedures manuals, training of volunteers. Inclusive of actual procedures during emergencies ......parking, pets, bag limits, medications, food, water, resident attendee name records etc and communications with RFS, SES, Police, SLC.
  - Community awareness and education presentation + demonstration.
  - Community communications through Street Contacts, Neighbour Alert Bulletin, Website, Facebook.
  - **D. Official Launch**
  - Scheduled for Sunday 11 December 10am.
  - Media release drafted. Invited Minister DITR, Fed Member (Dr Reid), NSW Member (Liesl Tesch), NSW Emergency Services (RFS & SES), PBPA Executive and project champions/volunteers, and Local Media.
  - In compliance with NSW Govt Bushfire Inquiry 2020 Rec #17, representation made to Central Coast Bushfire Management Committee seeking approval of the Community Support Centre as a designated a Neighbourhood Safer Place – at risk communities should have an indoor NSP.

### **Mobile Phone Tower – Connectivity Issues**

- Situation made worse with the installation of 5G technology.
- Matter originally raised in 2021 with former Robertson MP Lucy Wicks and Minister Fletcher
- Raised with new Robertson MP Dr Gordon Reid in July & August .....he referred issue with Minister. About to issue follow-up!

### AED Defibrillator Cabinets – Call out connectivity issue

- Changed from 3G to 4G/LTE technology in May '22
- Became aware of connectivity problem at end of August same as Mobile Ph Tower 5G issue !
- Matter raised with Aust Defibrillators unable to resolved. Agreed to extend Communications with Aust Defibrillators till 30 Nov; then
  review service continuation.
- Checking AED Cabinets call out connection regularly to ensure residents and public ability to open the cabinet and access the AED displayed CODE 6522






