




ARBORETUM LANDSCAPE MASTERPLAN 2023

We have commissioned a Landscape Architect to prepare a Landscape Masterplan for the Arboretum. We are mainly concerned with improving our entrances, making them more welcoming and creating equitable access to at least the main pathways and a new wetland boardwalk.

We will also explore "Connection to Country".

As part of this we have received funding from the Central Coast Protection of the Environment Trust Grant (POET GRANT - administered but not owned by Central Coast Council).

This will be used for:

- A land survey of the Arboretum
- An ecological study of the Arboretum


Pearl Beach Plodders


