Over the past 12 months, as the Vice President responsible for Central Coast Council (CCC) Liaison, I have successfully initiated a productive relationship with CCC and made significant progress in addressing infrastructure issues in Pearl Beach. My future plans are to continue this positive momentum by ensuring asset maintenance remains a priority and fostering ongoing communication with residents and CCC for further improvements.

Todate:

- 1. Established a working relationship with CCC by leveraging my experience and industry contacts, focusing on essential assets such as roads, drainage, roadside assets, and property.
- 2. Engaged in regular discussions with CCC's Director of Infrastructure, Boris Bolgoff, and his staff to improve the maintenance of these essential assets.
- 3. Conducted a baseline survey of roads in Pearl Beach, identifying and mapping over 250 road defects like potholes, road depressions, and blocked drainage, providing valuable data for discussions with CCC.
- 4. Submitted proposals to CCC for rectifying these defects.
- 5. Conducted on-site meetings with Boris and his team to review and discuss these proposals, including heavy patching and resealing of Diamond Rd.
- 6. Collaborated with CCC on additional mowing for roadside reserves and increased waste collection.
- 7. Regularly kept members updated on the progress and the status of CCC's 23/24/25-year capital works programs.

Future Plans:

- 1. Maintain a high priority re maintenance of essential assets to ensure they remain in good condition.
- 2. Be the primary point of contact for residents and provide updates on all CCC infrastructure matters.
- 3. Sustain regular dialogue with CCC regarding infrastructure maintenance and upgrades.
- 4. Focus on promoting poor drainage repairs along Diamond Rd before its final resurfacing in January.
- 5. Advocate for heavy patching road repairs and resealing on roads like Tourmaline, Crystal, Greenpoint, Pearl Beach Parade (Beach Parking), and Bus Stop areas.
